Covid -19 update

There have been no reported cases of COVID-19 linked to Mansfield Kindergarten. Should there be a case linked to the service, staff will notify the DHHS and kindergarten families immediately.

Attendance:

- All unwell children or staff must stay home.
- If your child is unwell or shows any signs of fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, body aches or fatigue, please contact your medical provider/GP and keep them at home until symptoms resolve.
- If a child begins experiencing symptoms of illness during a kindergarten session, they will be isolated in an appropriate space with suitable supervision.
 Parents/carers will be contacted to collect the child as soon as possible and seek medical advice.
- DHHS currently advise that people should seek medical advice and be tested for COVID-19 if they experience:

 Fever OR chills OR Acute respiratory infection e.g. cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose; or have been in contact with a known case of COVID-19. Children who have been tested will be excluded from kindergarten until tests results are clear. Please advise the kindergarten if your child has a confirmed case of COVID-19 or has been in close contact with a confirmed case in the preceding 14 days.
- Masks must be worn by all visitors over 12 years of age to the kindergarten, both indoors and outside.





Mirror Image – did you know...?

Writing letters and numbers in mirror image at this age is not uncommon. From the age of four to eight years, not all children have 'directionality' completely worked out. There is no reason to worry; our kindergarten program includes some left, right, up and down, behind, in front games to play with all the children.
