## Our programs to commence...

Over the coming weeks, our focus will be helping to create a sense of belonging for the children – creation of a safe place, of warm and trusting relationships with their teachers and peers. There will be different learning experiences available for the children to engage in, both indoors and outside – including literature, music, gross and fine motor activities, and the arts, as we get to know each other, our strengths, and areas of interest!

### How to survive separation anxiety

- Create quick good-bye rituals keep the good-bye short and sweet. If you linger, the transition time does too. So will the anxiety.
- **Be consistent.** Try to do the same drop-off with the same ritual at the same time each day you separate to avoid unexpected factors whenever you can.
- **Attention:** When separating, give your child full attention, be loving, and provide affection. Then say good-bye quickly despite their antics or cries for you to stay.
- **Be specific.** When you discuss your return, provide specifics that your child understands. If you know you'll be back by 3:00 pm, tell your child on their terms; for example, say, "I'll be back after lunch and play time." Define time they can understand.

'It is the warm and thoughtful relationships that children have with their families and communities that support their social development. They learn how to respect themselves, others, animals and the environment by watching how the important people in their lives manage these same interactions.'

#### Painting and drawing

Drawing enables children to communicate their ideas visually, through representing what they have seen, done, felt and thought about. Children learn to draw by drawing and progress through the stages of scribble to symbolic, onto recognisable symbols and to visual realism. Opportunities to draw enable children to develop observation skills and imagination.

Drawing and painting is available every day. We provide a selection of drawing materials and paper. The easel is set up, sometimes with home-made paint, sometimes acrylic, sometimes with a variety of colours, sometimes just one.
